Students Celebrate Peace

Students and staff at Carmel College gathered together to celebrate a Peace Liturgy during World RE Week in March.

All students in the College created an origami paper crane to celebrate this event as these are an ancient origami pattern that symbolises health and peace.

Cranes for Peace was inspired by the story of Sasaki Sadako, a 12 year old girl from Japan who died as a result of the bombing of Hiroshima.

The beautiful cranes were displayed in a specially created box made by the DT department and were displayed in the centre of the College. Fr Seamus Doyle, Parish Priest of St. Augustine's RC Church, Darlington, came and blessed the symbols of peace and led the College in a short liturgy with music provided by the Liturgy Group.
